This event will be interactive, including a participatory panel discussion. After a quiz with the audience to test their knowledge linking freshwater conservation and WASH approaches, participants will examine challenges and opportunities related to working with government or policy around integration of WASH and freshwater ecosystem conservation. The panel of 5-6 presenters will examine how integrated freshwater conservation-WASH programs can catalyze work around meeting multiple SDG commitments and reflect on what meeting those commitments really means through examples of different approaches carried out at the national level down to local or district level. Examples of approaches at the local level will also focus on how civil society organizations are engaging local and national governments, the decisions being made, and how civil society organization actions at all levels are essential ensure there is an interplay between policy and practice.
